## **Small Group Questions**





#### The Big Idea

For the month of October, we're looking at a sermon Jesus gives about the end of the world. He uses the destruction of Jerusalem (which happens in the 1<sup>st</sup> century) to talk about the end of the world. It's a dress rehearsal for the 2<sup>nd</sup> coming. Jesus tells us to prepare for his coming in five distinct ways: *don't be distracted* (vss.5-7); *don't be deceived* (vs.8); *don't be afraid* (vss.9-11); *don't be quiet* (vss.12-19); and *don't give up* (vss.20-33).

#### **Getting Started**

**1)** If you knew in 2019 what you now know about 2020-2021, what would you have done to prepare for these difficult years? What are some 'opportunities' you could have seized?

#### **Digging Deeper**

- 2) When someone says, "I have an opportunity for you," this almost always suggest something positive. Give some examples.
- 3) Read verse 13 and then go back and read verses 12-19.
  - **a)** This wasn't what Jesus' disciples where hoping they would experience. What were likely some positive opportunities they were expecting instead?
  - b) What are some other passages that describe persecution in a positive way?
- **4)** The opportunity is to "bear witness." With this word Jesus wants us to think of a courtroom (vs.12). Discuss these questions in light of the courtroom image:
  - · Who is on trial?
  - Who's the prosecutor and what's the case being made?
  - Who's the defense attorney and what's the case being made (cf. John 16:7-11)?
  - Who's the witness, and how is the defense attorney using the witness?

<b>6)</b> J	lesus describes "witness-intimidation/harassment" in several ways.
í	a) Go through the text and identify the different ways Jesus' witnesses are harassed.
I	o) Share a story of a Christian who has suffered persecution.
•	c) There are subtle ways Jesus' witnesses can be harassed today. Work through the following list and discuss how this can and does happen: Social discrimination, institutional discrimination, employment discrimination, legal discrimination. What would you add?
