Victor and Virgilia have been serving in Honduras since 1996 where he works as the Associate Director of the Honduran Extension Bible Institute – West (HEBI-West). The HEBI program exists to train new pastors and plant churches by extension in rural areas where there is no evangelical work being done. This model gives access to training to people who cannot leave their communities to attend a school in a larger city. Currently they average 4 new church plants per year! Victor and Virgilia keep very busy with many projects that they lead, such as: providing motorcycles to pastors so that they can travel as they serve in ministry, Victor has a very successful prison ministry, each year they host a women's conference for the wives of pastors to give them support and refreshment and they are continually gathering supplies and financial support for the educational needs of children in the poor, remote communities that they serve.

Jonathan and Heidi have lived in a remote village among the Isnag people of the Philippines since 1999. In their 20 years of ministry they have worked to translate many books of the Bible into the Isnag language, including 2nd Corinthians, Ephesians, Romans and Acts. The translation process is long, tedious and time consuming. Jonathan works with a few locals who check his work to make sure that the translation is accurate and presents the correct message. Heidi helps with the translation process, teaches life skills like sewing to women in their village and she also hosts women's Bible studies. Living in the village has allowed Jonathan and Heidi the very special opportunity to develop deep and meaningful relationships with the people in the community.

Robert and Priscilla live in Pakistan where they have served since 1994. They are integral in the operation of the Shikarpur Christian Hospital which serves local women and children. Priscilla is a doctor so her days, and often nights, are filled with appointments, surgeries, deliveries and meeting other needs of her patients. Robert's primary role is maintaining the infrastructure of the hospital and homes of the missionaries working there. They hold morning chapel for the staff and patients at the hospital. Hiring local women to work at the hospital is also a great opportunity for them to evangelize in this largely Muslim country. Pakistan is a very difficult place to live and work – it is often above 100 degrees for 6 months or more!

Humberto and Carmen live in Northern Honduras where they have served as leaders of the Honduran Extension Bible Institute since 1981. The HEBI program exists to train new pastors and plant churches by extension in rural areas where there is no evangelical work being done. This model gives access to training to people who cannot leave their communities to attend a school in a larger city. Once a student finishes his training he is sent out into his community to share the gospel with those around him. When a church reaches 25 regular attendees, they become eligible to receive funding (and often a team from the U.S.) to build a church building. The program is even beginning to send out missionary pastors into different countries, even the United States!

Radha and Samen work with Cambodian Christians both in the United States and in Cambodia. Through Missions Door Radha serves as the Cambodian Ministry Specialist and Coordinator. His primary role in this position is to produce material for training and developing church leaders. Once or twice a year Radha travels to Cambodia for several months to teach and train new leaders and pastors in several locations across the country. There is also an educational farm that is supported by CMC that helps people learn to raise animals for food and income. They also have an educational sewing program for women. Radha and Samen also work with a network of U.S. Cambodian churches to train leaders and support them; they have a conference each year where all of the Cambodian Churches in the Northwest gather to share, learn and encourage one another.

In 2016, the Najjars were called to go to the

Middle East. They joined an organization with ample experience in the region, called Pioneers. They went to Jordan in 2017 and spent time learning Arabic; serving refugees (mostly Syrian) through a local church using English classes, food programs, soccer, and massage; and discipling converts to Christianity. They were in the process of starting a Latin American Cultural Center to help bring Latin missionaries from Pioneers and other missions organizations to Jordan, and to open opportunities to share the Gospel through language learning. But before it could be opened, they were deported from Jordan. No official reasons were given by the authorities, but we know it was because of sharing the Gospel with Jordanian non-Christians.

Now the Lord has opened up the door for them through Pioneers to start a new mobilization base in Egypt to send out Arabic speaking missionaries to plant churches in unreached areas. Mike is starting to serve as Associate Director of the base. Currently there are about two dozen candidates ready to be trained and evaluated. About half of them are Egyptians and the other half are from Sudan. There is a large population of Sudanese refugees in Egypt, and Pioneers has had a strong and growing ministry among them for many years. Most of them will serve in areas of Egypt or Sudan where there is little or no Christian influence, but others may be sent to other parts of the Middle East. Mike and Lesly have always had a strong vision to see developing countries send missionaries to other parts of the world, and this position will allow us to realize that goal sending out Arabs and potentially helping to help many Latin American missionaries from our organization to transition to ministry in Egypt and the Middle East.

Their platform in order to stay in the country will be to work a couple days a week as Language teachers at a language school that we are helping to set up with a local church in the city of Tanta (about 60 miles from Cairo). Lesly will continue to use massage therapy as a ministry tool to build friendships and they will be involved in relational ministry in their neighborhood and wherever the Lord opens opportunities.
